Q: Does the notice of intent to apply bind me to do anything?

A: The Notice of Intent to Apply from and full application are nonbinding documents. Upon acceptance, there will be agreements and terms of the pilot that will require commitments; however, an application implies only interest in the programmatic opportunities.

O: Will this cost me anything?

A: There are not costs associated with apply for the program. If your organization is selected and energy audit is conducted, you will have the opportunity to finance energy efficiency improvement recommendations based on your organizations resources and capacity.

Q: What if I am a 501 c 2?

A: The program partners have decided to limit eligibility to 501 (c) 3 or 4 and tribal organizations.

Q: What happens when someone needs to only use part of the program? How is that evaluated?

A: Applicants should apply if they feel they can benefit from any resources the pilot offers. The review committee will determine eligibility and how the resources can be applied in each applicant's circumstances.

Q: What if my organizations doesn't have an energy audit?

A: If you don't have an energy audit, the pilot will provide one for you.

Q: What if my organizations doesn't have a financial audit?

A: Depending on the size of an organization, not all nonprofits are required to have a full financial audit, if this is the case, please provide your organization's most recent financial review.

Q: How do I submit the full application?

A: The entire application can be submitted by email, in person, by post or by fax.

Q: Where in the FNRP application do I mention if I have any pre-existing grants?

A: If your organization has already secured a grant or funding for an energy efficiency or capital project, please include all information in the project narrative about where pre-existing resources come from and whether your organization is an Alaska Mental Health beneficiary.
